### Cordata After School Enrichment Programs

**Cordata Elementary is excited to offer 14 clubs ranging in grade levels this quarter!** Clubs are offered for 8 weeks from January 23<sup>rd</sup> – March 18<sup>th</sup> (with no clubs on Feb, 18<sup>th</sup>). Our goal is to create opportunities for all children and families in the Cordata community to expand their learning, become more connected to school, and explore their interests and talents outside of the formal school day. However, space is limited in clubs so please send in your forms as soon as possible. Depending on student interest, we may have a waiting list for this quarter.

- A healthy snack break after the school day
- Modified bus transportation available at 4:30 pm on Monday and Wednesday

## Mondays

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### **Basketball Club (FREE)**

**Instructor:** Courtney Lange / YMCA

**Open to K – 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students (12 students maximum)**

**Mondays 2:30 – 4:30 pm**

This YMCA program will teach basketball with a non-competitive focus, teaching skills in passing, dribbling, shooting, and defense. We will work on drills and small-sided play and work into scrimmages as the program progresses.

### **Color and Chillax Club (FREE)**

**Open to K - 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students (15 students maximum)**

**Mondays 2:30 – 4:30 pm**

Come relax in Color and Chillax Club, where we will learn calming meditation exercises, go on lovely nature walks, practice story-telling, yoga, color mandalas, and make lots of beautiful, relaxing crafts that can be taken home and used when you want to feel calm and happy.

### **Leadership Club (FREE)**

**Open to 3<sup>rd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> grade students (25 students maximum)**

**Mondays 2:30 – 4:30 pm**

This club continues from the Fall club and encourages new members to join in! Kids will build leadership skills through games, skits, acting, telling stories, and many other fun activities led by an awesome group of mentors trained in the nationally acclaimed program, Teach One to Lead One. This club also features service projects to benefit the school and the community, all while building healthy habits in youths that will benefit them for the rest of their lives.

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## **Games Club (FREE)**

**Wednesdays 2:30 – 4:30 pm**

We will be spending the first half of our time playing fun group games outside and the second half playing board games inside. This will be a great club for kids that need to build their social and emotional skills as well as develop their confidence through playing fun group games.

## **Improv Club (FREE)**

**Open to 3<sup>rd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> grade students (14 students maximum)**

**Wednesdays 2:30 – 4:30 pm**

Immerse yourself in the mysterious art of acting with a focus in improvisation and working together to craft theatre experiences that will blow your mind. Learn how to let down your walls with safety and fun. In taking the chance to say yes to one another, you will have the opportunity to create an experience which is greater than the sum of its parts. The greatest goal of this course is to further the theatrical knowledge of any interested in theatre and to help prepare students for all walks of life. Whether you wish to become a movie star or just like to play and grow with others, this high energy, team building course is for you!

## **Lego Club (FREE)**

## **Passport Club (FREE)**

Travel around the world with the Cordata Passport Club. Every week students will explore a new country and their culture. Each week is aligned with a holiday or celebration from a specific country wherein students will create related crafts and possibly hear from natives of each country.

## **Sword Skirmish Club (FREE)**

**Open to 3<sup>rd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> grade students (20 students maximum)**

**Wednesdays 2:30 – 4:30 pm**

Sword Skirmish is a club focused on playing a variety of active games using boffer swords and small bean bags. The physical games all have a fantasy twist such as Dwarves vs Goblins and Kings Gem. While encouraging cooperation and team building these games also foster imagination and play.

## **Woodworking Club (FREE)**

**Open to K- 5<sup>th</sup> grade students (15 students maximum)**

**Wednesdays 2:30 – 4:30 pm**

While constructing wooden projects ranging from paddle boats to trucks, book holders to bird feeders and toolboxes, children ages 5 to 12 develop woodworking skills with basic hand tools. Students begin by making a simple project while learning tool usage and safety procedures. After completing their first project, students choose from a wide variety of projects according to their individual interests. Designing their own projects is encouraged.

### **Futsal Club (FREE)**

**Thursdays 12:45 – 2:30 pm**

Futsal is a variation of soccer played on a hard-court surface between two teams of five players each. The ball is smaller, with less bounce than a regulation soccer ball. The game focuses on creativity, skill, and technique, as well as ball control and passing in small spaces.

# TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

## **Transportation Options:**

You must choose ONE of the below transportation options to get your child home safely after the Cordata Enrichment Programs:

- 1) Pick up your child at Cordata Elementary;
- 2) Ride the bus to a bus stop on the below modified route (for MONDAYS and WEDNESDAYS only.)

## **IMPORTANT!!! If your child is going to be absent from a club or their Go-Home plan changes:**

Please call the Cordata Office as soon as possible to let us know if your child will be absent from clubs, or if their Go-Home plan has changed. If a parent does not inform the Office directly of an absence or change in Go-Home plan, **we will be calling all student contact numbers until we locate your child to make sure they are safe, which is our top priority.**

## **Bus Transportation: ( \* Provided on MONDAYS and WEDNESDAYS only. )**

Free MODIFIED bus transportation is offered for students participating in Cordata Enrichment Programs on Mondays and Wednesdays only. **Buses will NOT drop students off at home** but instead at the designated bus stops listed below. If you choose the bus option, you must **select ONE bus drop off location**. Students will NOT be allowed off of the bus at another drop off location. Safety is our number one priority. **A child always has the option to notify the driver and remain on the bus which will return to Cordata Elementary.**

## **Safety/Go-Home Plan:**

**Please talk to your child about their go-home plan since it differs from what they are used to.** Some families may choose to drive their child to the new bus drop off location so they are familiar before their first day in the program. Please talk through these scenarios with your child and what they should do in case something doesn't go as planned:

- What should your child do if they don't see you at their 'new' drop off location?
- What should your child do if they forget to get off the bus in the 'new' location?
